2. Design a Mobile Book Report (see attachment) that represents the book that was read. Please follow the attached instructions carefully. Points will be deducted for book reports that do not follow these instructions (see Rubric).
3. Fill in all of the information. Be sure to write neatly.
 - a. Write the title, author, illustrator, and your name in the spaces provided.
 - b. In each heart, write one thing that you LOVED about the book.
4. Be creative! Use crayons/markers to make it colorful. (Additional decorations may be used.)
5. Make sure that your Mobile Book Report is ready to hang for presentation and/or display. See example pictures on website (www.mseastclass.com).
6. This book report is due on: **Thursday, January 31st**. Points will be deducted for book reports turned in after the due date.

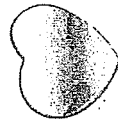

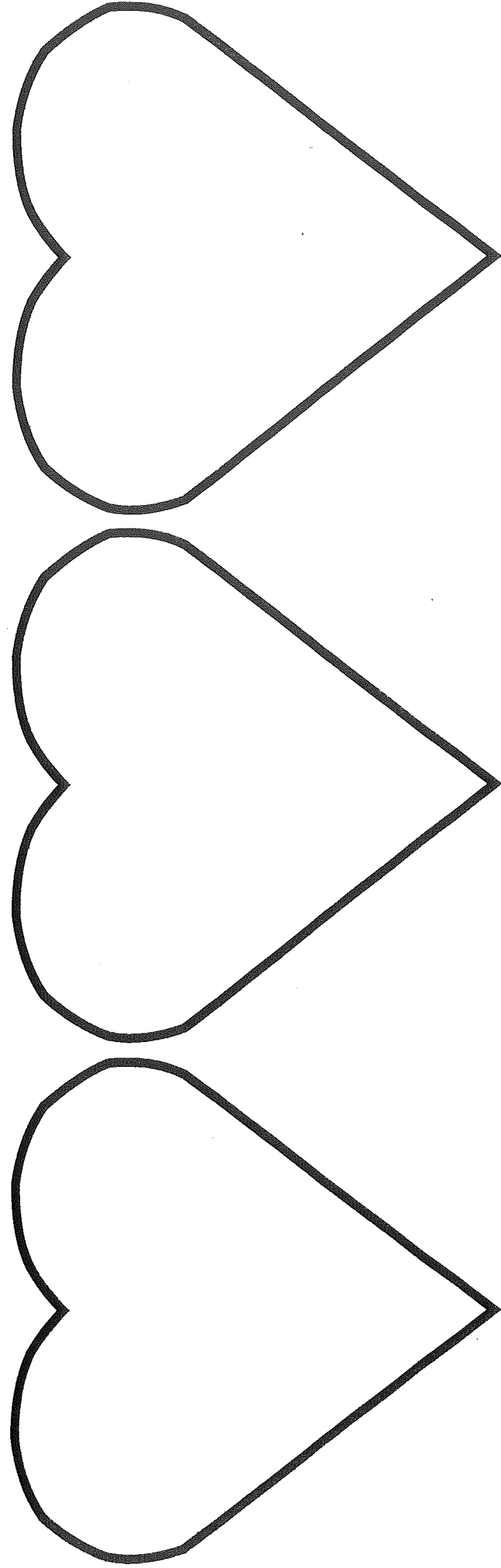
