## Rules:

- r. 4 - a, e, o, and u usually say /ā/, /ē/, /ō/, /ū/ at the end of a syllable (meg, navy, open, music)
- r. 5 - i and y usually say /ī/ (big, gym), but may say /i/ (silent, my, type)
- r. 6 - y, not i, is used at the end of English words (my, by)
- r. 17 - double l, f, and s when following a single vowel at the end of a one-syllable word (will, off, miss)

## Silent Finale E Jobs:

- Job 1 - The silent final e lets the vowel say its name.
