Rules:

- r. 4 - a, e, o, and u usually say /ā/, /ē/, /ō/, /ū/ at the end of a syllable (me, navy, open, music)
- r. 6 - y, not i, is used at the end of English words (my, by)
- r. 13 - sh is used at the beginning or end of a base word (she, dish), at the end of a syllable (fin ish), but never at the beginning of a syllable after the first syllable except for the suffix -ship (worship, friendship)
- r. 17 - double l, f, and s when following a single vowel at the end of a one-syllable word (will, off, miss)
- r. 18 - use ay to say /ā/ at the end of a base word (play, day, say)

Silent Finale E Jobs:

- Job 1 - The silent final e lets the vowel say its name.
- Job 5 - No job e. There is no reason for the silent final e.
